Card sorting


The study consisted of a digital card sorting activity and some post activity questions based around website language and phraseology. It was completed by 14 users:

- 57.1% residents.


The findings from the analysis will help us to map clear signposting, validate the current structure and uncover any issues within the IA and content for further discussion or improvement.














Questionnaire

Users were asked a series of post study questions around website language and phraseology. This included a choice of titles of some of the service areas and the chance to give a title suggestion or comment. - Children and young people




The 2 "other" participant suggestions were:

- Running the council




The 1 "other" participant suggestion was:

• Environmental health and emergencies


3 participants also added additional comments on this section:

- Can't think of one that covers all these topics




The 1 "other" participant suggestion was:

Summary

This summary has been included to highlight any recurring themes or areas for further discussion.

It is important to note that the results are captured from a small group of residents and stakeholders and work as part of the larger discovery piece.

57% of users placed 'commercial, hazardous and clinical waste' in 'environment'. 21% of users placed it under 'bins and recycling'.

36% of users felt the 'climate change action plan' related to 'planning'. 29% of users placed under 'environment'.

Users felt 'streets, roads and transport' would include:

- pavement obstructions
- street sweeping
- applying for a play street
- reporting dog fouling
- travel passes and concessions
- reporting a tree problem

93% of users placed 'reusable nappy vouchers' under 'children and young people'. 7% of users placed under 'benefits'. No participants put this under 'bins & recycling' where it currently sits.

Users felt 'consultations' should sit under:

- council and elections 43%
- planning 29%
- I don't know 21%
- community, safety and emergencies 7%

The four cards that were most frequently placed in the 'I don't know' category were:

- voluntary sector 43%
- Haringey, here to help 29%
- Haringey warm welcome 29%
- venues for hire in Haringey 29%

'consultations', 'reporting a tree problem' and 'climate change action plan' were also often placed in the 'I don't know' pile.

Users were certain 'reporting ASB' and 'flooding' should sit in 'community'. It is important to make it clear what the 'community' section covers so that it is not doubling up as a second 'environment' section or becoming a dumping ground. The user comments from the questionnaire also back up the potential confusion with these areas. Ensure the identity of both areas is clear and that the purpose doesn't become blurred, leading to duplicate information being created in the future.

Users felt that 'benefits' should cover areas like:

- reusable nappy vouchers
- free school meals and clothing grant
- travel passes and concessions

Users felt that, alongside 'elections' and 'consultations', the 'council and elections' section should include:

- here to help
 - warm welcome
 - climate change action plan
 - SEND local offer
