This exhibition shares these histories and stories from West Green Road, looking at objects, photographs, and documents from the collections of Bruce Castle Museum & Archive. It also shows in public for the first time personal items and works from the amazing art studio of textile designer Althea McNish, very kindly on loan from The N15 Archive , alongside new artwork created for the exhibition by local artist and architect Tania Pascoal.

	Kwanza is a secular festival observed by many African Americans from 26 th December to 1 st January as a celebration of their cultural heritage and traditional values. Kwanzaa—which is derived from the word "first" in Swahili—takes inspiration from the start of the harvest season in Africa, when the first crops are gathered. This is a time that has been celebrated throughout the continent for generations. During the week, families gather to give gifts, share feasts, and light candles in honour of their ancestors and their hopes for the future.
