Consultation on Parking Controls

Willoughby Lane Parking Arrangements

Introduction

We are writing to ask for your views on the introduction of parking arrangements in your street. Residents of Willoughby Lane have told us that they are finding it difficult to park near their homes due to pressures created by those outside the area, who take advantage of the current free or unrestricted parking arrangements on non-event days. We would like to know if you want us to work with you to design and introduce parking controls.

What we are proposing

We welcome your views on Willoughby Lane becoming a controlled parking zone (CPZ). This would provide safe, managed parking spaces for residents and their visitors, with operational times that suit residents best <u>and include the retention of existing event day controls</u>.

If you think that parking controls will make your street work better, please tell us what operational times you would prefer. Our questionnaire does suggest operational hours as we need some consistency in approach, but if you like the idea of a CPZ, but do not want all-day controls, please complete question 6.

If the majority of those responding favour the introduction of a CPZ, but do not support all day controls, Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm, we will write to you again suggesting two options, established from the two most supported options in response to question 6. This will ensure arrangements are tailored to your needs and preferences.

If the majority of those responding do not want parking controls, the Council will not take any further action. This approach is supported by the revised Resident Engagement and Parking Schemes Policy which can be found here:

Other changes on offer

Dedicated disabled parking bays (those that can only be used by one vehicle registration) are one of the benefits being offered by the Council to help residents with severe walking impairments and those residents who cannot travel far to their vehicle. The bays are intended to provide eligible residents with easy access to and from their homes and ensure sufficient room to manoeuvre in and out of their vehicle. If, however, you do not have access to the internet, you can request a dedicated disabled parking bay under Q7 within the questionnaire.

What happens next?

Our estimated timeline to progress this project is detailed below.

- March 2024: Council Officers will analyse responses and prepare recommendations for reporting.
- March/ April 2024: Officers will prepare a report with recommendations which will be submitted for a decision to a key officer in consultation with the relevant Cabinet Member.
- May 2024: We will write to you to update you on the public engagement and decision outcome. If changes are required and approved, we can then progress to statutory consultation.
- <u>July 2024</u>: Statutory consultation, which includes advertising the necessary changes in the local newspapers allowing anyone to object to the proposals.
- August 2024: Officers will prepare a second report with recommendations on whether to implement the changes on the street. This decision is likely to be taken by the relevant Cabinet Member.
- <u>September / October 2024</u>: We will write to you again to inform you if any changes will be implemented and the timeframe for this.
