THE HARINGEY (STAPLETON HALL ROAD N4) (SPECIAL EVENT) TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC ORDER 2024

Made: 1st May 2024

Coming into operation: 10th May 2024

The 'Council' of the London Borough of Haringey being the traffic authority for certain roads in that London borough is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited by reason of a special event and in exercise of its powers under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended and of all other enabling powers the Council hereby makes the following Order.

- This Order shall come into operation on 10th May 2024 and may be cited as the Haringey (Stapleton Hall Road N4) (Special Event) Temporary Prohibition of Traffic Order 2024.
- 2. During the period 3.00pm and 5.00pm on the 10th May 2024 or when the event has completed, whichever is the sooner, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in Stapleton Hall Road N4 in the Borough of Haringey, between its junction with Granville Road and its junction with Albany Road.
- **3.** The prohibitions specified in article 2 above shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
- 4. Nothing in this Order shall apply to: -
 - (a) any vehicle being used in connection with the event;
 - (b) any vehicle being used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes;
 - (c) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or Civil Enforcement Officer;
 - (d) any vehicle necessitating access to a property in a prohibited length of road, if the event allows.
