

Haringey's Holiday, Activity and Food Programme (HAF): Annual Report 2023-2024





Introduction to HAF

The Holiday, Activity and Food Programme, funded by the Department for Education, operates in Haringey in the Spring, Summer, and Winter longer school holidays. Families who are in receipt of benefit-related Free School Meals can book a range of activities for their children aged 5-16. The main aims of HAF in Haringey are to:

- Provide children and young people with a range of high-quality physical activity, food and enrichment within their local community and further afield
- Encourage participation in new activities and locations, with a focus on inclusive, child-led engagement
- Support a holistic approach to healthy living for the whole family, including signposting to other support
- Build sustainable provision within schools and community organisations

Highlights in 2023-2024

Highlights from 2023-2024 include:


- Programmed activities with a focus on children learning new skills and having new experiences such as cooking, gardening, exposure to non-traditional physical activities such as orienteering, construction, adventure play and physical theatre.
- Trips to London Zoo, Go Karting, Go Ape, Alexandra Palace, Southend on Sea, Pendarren Outdoor Education Centre, Princess Diana Memorial Playground and many more
- Launching a new creative arts strand of the HAF Programme which included delivery from local arts and culture organisations such as Bruce Castle Museum, Rollernation, Bernie Grant Arts Centre and Haringey Shed
- Supporting providers with training in Food Hygiene and Health and Safety, Autism Awareness and First Aid training courses, as well as offering regular 'provider network' meetings to share ideas, feedback and best practice for HAF delivery
- Partnership with HelloFresh, with a donation of food boxes which delivered 800 meal kits to 200 Haringey families over the Christmas holidays



HAF Participation

Of the 9690 children in Haringey who are registered as eligible for HAF, Haringey's average participation for unique participants across 2023-2024 is 21%.


Funding



• Haringey was granted £989,970 from the Department for Education to run the HAF Programme from April 2023-2024

 A total of £86,331 was spent on administrative expenditure, including staffing of one full-time HAF Programme Manager and some additional part-time support from Officers from Haringey's Active Communities Team.

• The remaining grant total was spent on programme delivery, broken down into the three holiday periods of Easter, Summer and Christmas funding; 18% was spent on Easter, 62% on Summer and 11% on Winter activities and food.





SEND and Inclusive Practice

- From consultation with parents and other local authorities, our approach to SEND provision and HAF is two-fold: we have a strand of specialist SEND providers who deliver activities on a referral basis, and we also work with mainstream providers to make inclusion embedded in their camps through training and support.
- Our SEND specialist providers include two Special Schools, a SEND adventure playground, and a SEND-Specialist faith-based provider, who also sit within our Short Breaks commissioned core offer.
- We partnered with local charity Ambitious About Autism to produce a HAF and Understanding Autism training and resources for all our providers, to ensure that their HAF settings are inclusive for children with neuro-differences.
- Over the Winter holidays, we placed additional support workers with SEND experience in our mainstream provisions to support those with additional needs.
- Our printed holiday booklet has a key for each activity with an inclusion rating to help families select suitable activities for their children.



Key: Inclusion

Inclusion rating

This year each of our activities will have a coloured rating of what level of support they can provide for their participants. If you/your young person needs additional support, please use the guide below to better identify what level of support activities can provide. If unsure, please contact the provider for more information.

Blue rating: Sessions are open to all, and we can support individuals needing some additional assistance and adapt the activity accordingly, while expecting independent participation for most of

- the activity.
 Green rating: Session are open to all, and we can provide support to individuals with higher levels of need, although one-to-one support is not available. We strive to make reasonable accommodations to foster inclusivity.
- Yellow rating: The activity is designed to offer tailored support to individuals with high levels of need.



Marketing and Communications

- Our 'Holiday Fun' booklet which is printed and distributed every Summer holiday contains our HAF listings and is available in schools, community spaces and leisure venues, with over 25,000 copies available
- We used social media to promote the programme using Twitter/X, Facebook, local WhatsApp groups for parents and newsletters to spread the word to eligible families to access our dedicated centralised booking website of activities

Looking forward: HAF in Haringey in 2024-2025

We are delighted to be able to deliver HAF in Haringey again in 2024-2025, with a grant allocation of £961,490. Our aims for the next 12 months are:

- Increase number of participants aged 13-16 engaging with our HAF programmes through Youth Services partnership
- Have 100% of providers trained in our 'Understanding Autism and HAF' training module
- Expand the arts and non-traditional physical activity elements of the programme to ensure that children and young people are excited and engaged with HAF activity sessions
- Deliver 3 First Aid training sessions/refreshers for HAF providers throughout the year
- Encourage more providers to deliver food in-house to increase sustainability and reduce
 environmental impact
- Introduce a quality assurance framework for consistency across HAF providers in delivery of the HAF standards
